### 251kg of Food Donated at the ASDA Food Drive!

At the beginning of June, Aberdeen North Foodbank had the opportunity to collect food donations in a week-long ASDA Food Drive from Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> – Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup>. We were delighted to have received 251kg of food and toiletries to continue the important work of the foodbank and reach local people in need.

We would like to extend a HUGE thank you to Asda, their staff, our amazing volunteers and everyone who donated items to Aberdeen North Foodbank throughout the week. It was a great chance to spread awareness about the foodbank and the increasing need; we received such generosity and kindness from the general public.

In the last calendar year we distributed over 25,000kg of food in Aberdeen North across 5 foodbank centres!

The foodbank has changed a lot in the four years I've been here, but it has always been a welcoming space, and I love going there because it brings you into contact with so many amazing people - both the wonderful volunteers and those who come to us for food. Most of our time volunteering is spent making up food parcels and talking with people, and I'd encourage people to come and try a session if either of those things sound interesting!

In a better world, foodbanks wouldn't exist. That people are increasingly in situations where they need us speaks to a deep failure of care in our society, and foodbanks can only ever be sticking plasters over that wound. However, for as long as foodbanks do

exist to meet a need, I'd like to think that our foodbank is a space where everyone feels welcome, and that the support we provide makes a real difference in people's lives."

#### New Statistics Show 320% Increase of Foodbank Usage at Aberdeen North Foodbank in Year Ending March 2023 Compared to the Previous Year

On Wednesday 26 April, The Trussell Trust released our End of Year stats. They include shocking new figures which reveal that over 10,600 emergency food parcels were provided to local people in Aberdeen North who couldn't afford the essentials between April 2022 and March 2023 – nearly 4,000 of these went to children.


